The module aims to:

Indicative Module Content

Module topics

- **Principles of Building Pathology**

Consideration of professional liability for those involved in building pathology and defect diagnosis. Analysis of skills, knowledge and attributes necessary for effective professional practice within a digital landscape.

- **Investigation and Diagnosis of Failure in Domestic and Non-Domestic Buildings**

Consideration regarding the mechanisms of building failure in both domestic and non-domestic buildings, and synthesize appropriate diagnostic methods to formulate effective repair strategies, while considering sustainability, regulatory standards, and professional responsibility.

This content will be reviewed and updated regularly to reflect the legal, moral and financial changes in professional standards and practice.
